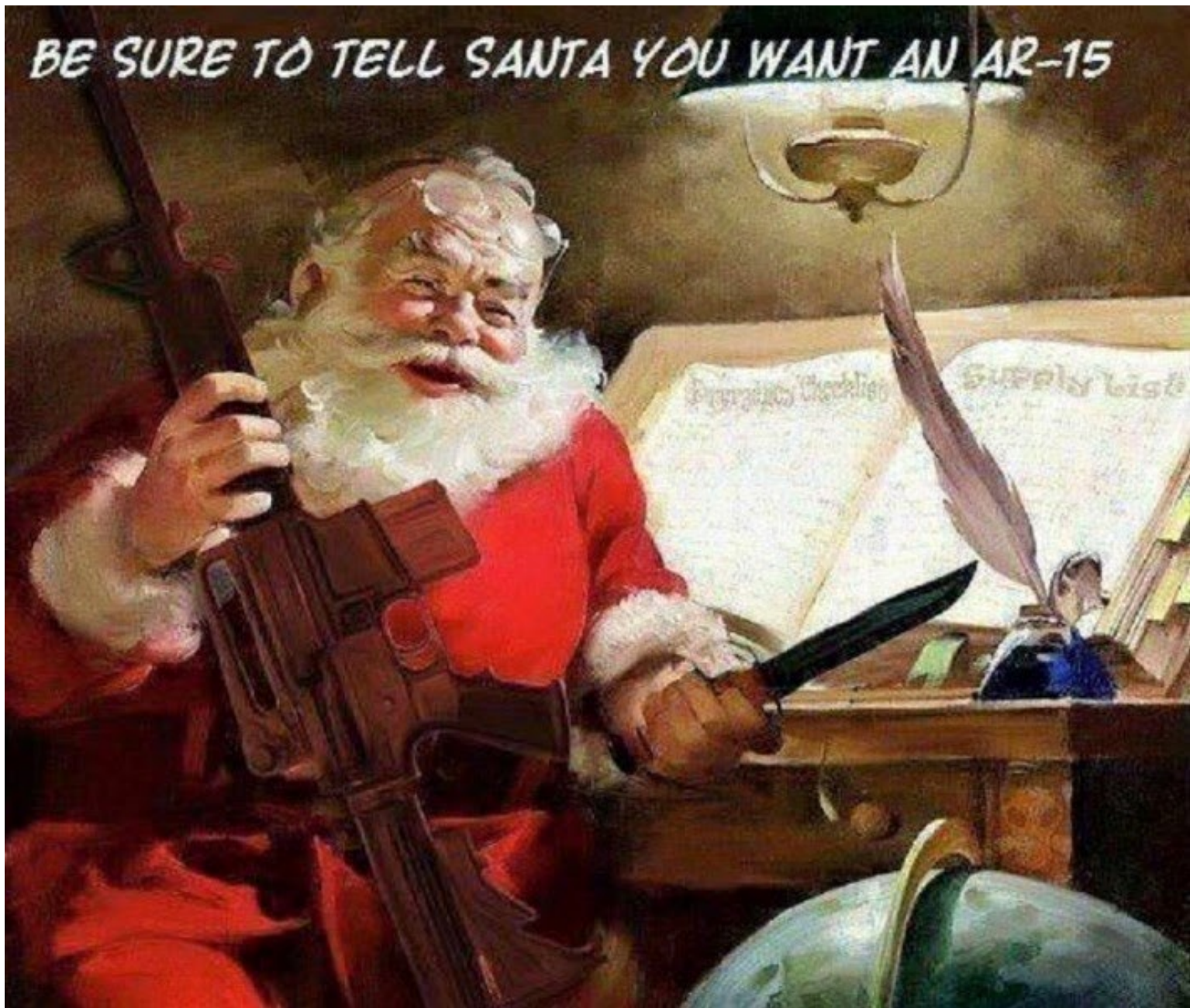

## Upper Pistol Range Roof Project

From Ted Hildabrand,

In a previous newsletter, Mark credited me as handling all this projects work. I really appreciate the compliment! However, numerous members of the club were involved. In fact, that is so typical of how we have done good projects, with a lot of members involved. Incorporating the memberships work and insight on all aspects of the project is a hallmark characteristic of DML and the way I like to handle projects.

During the initial planning 2-3 years ago, Ron Watton, George Taylor, Bill Fertall and I planned the work. However, there was considerable previous discussions with Bruce Ungar, ERO, and GT about replacing the old roof and the scope of a new roof. The significant scope item was covering the baffles and correcting some weak aspects on the original baffle design on the target side of this structure. I did budget and plan a design for the work. However, based on advice from ERO, Nick Kuzy, and even Chuck Augenstein, I revised the original balanced truss design to incorporate their input. I was unable to incorporate all of the input, but in each case I modified aspects of the project per this advice. I prepared drawings and specs for the work. Once a budget was approved I ordered the trusses from 84 Lumber. Ell Vines had made several recommendation on previous roof work that I purchase trusses from 84 Lumber. I had Jeff Kelly and Ray Walton help me with collecting measurements and collecting elevations using a engineers level to get finishing measurements for the truss design.

Prior to construction there was a significant amount of advance work needed to prepare the UPR structure for the new roof. Included was work on wiring and equipment removal for audio, AC power and lighting relocation. Paul Puglia and Bill Fertall took the lead on this work activity. Bruce Long, Ray Walton, Mike Leone , Nick Kuzy, and maybe some others that I may have forgotten, worked with Bill and Paul as it required several mini work parties to get it done. The work included getting Scheel Electric to relocate and set some of the high OH range lighting. Bill is still handling work on finishing the project. The work is actually not totally complete. There are several work components outstanding by the roof contractor. There is also some residual structural work but Bill is handling this in fine fashion as he does in all of his work. Paul Puglia also made some additional electrical improvements. Some of this work incorporated lighting and electrical work on the pavilion at the rear of the range. Some of the AC power was relocated in buried conduit in lieu of over head. It is anticipated that some additional structural work is needed next year to actually bring the whole project to total fruition.

It was fun project and a nice improvement. All of those involved, which are numerous, can take pride in their contribution. Again so typical of DML with significant support by all.

**NRA Whittington Center - Youth Adventure Camp Grant**

The Club has established The Dormont Mt. Lebanon Sportsmen's Club - George Taylor IV - NRA Whittington Center - Youth Adventure Camp Grant.

The purpose of this Grant is to subsidize a 13 -17 year old individual whose parent, or grandparent is a member of the Dormont Mt. Lebanon Sportsmen's Club (DMSC) so that the individual can attend the NRA-Youth Adventure Camp.

The NRA Youth Adventure Camp is located at the 30,000 acre NRA Whittington Center, in Raton, New Mexico. Dates reserved for the 2019 Camp session are June 23 – July 5, 2019. During their session individuals will attend training on firearm safety, shooting fundamentals, have the opportunity to fire numerous types of firearms, receive instruction on hunting safety and learn wilderness survival techniques.

The cost of attending the Camp is \$1,100.00. DMSC will subsidize ½ - the cost of attendance- \$550.00- and provide an additional \$300.00 for expenses for a total of \$850.00

The Individual must first complete the DMSC Application. If awarded the DMSC Grant, the NRA Whittington Center Youth Adventure Camp Application must then be completed.

## AMERICA'S RIFLE CHALLENGE (ARC)

### 2018 Was a Very Good Year

The ARC program here at DMSC concluded its third year of operation, and by all accounts, it appears to be well received by the membership. For those of you who are still not familiar with ARC, it is an action rifle program developed by the NRA. Participants use mostly AR style rifles and enjoy a variety of stages quite different from traditional bullseye shooting. Distances include 200, 100, 50, 25, and 7 yards – four shooting positions are used – firing from behind barricades – multiple magazine changes – and shooting at multiple targets.

With origins in 2016, the program began with two Basic level matches. This allowed the ARC cadre to gain some sea legs and to measure interest – a total of 25 participants came out for these two matches. In 2017 we again held two matches, but this time one was a Basic match and one was an Advanced match. By testing these waters, information was gathered on conducting a more challenging type event – there was a slight increase to 29 participants.

The ARC program ushered in the 2018 season with some bold initiatives:

- 10 matches total were held spread out over 7 days
- Introduction of a Clinic for participants new to action rifle matches – we held 2 of these.
- 3 Basic Matches
- 3 Advanced Matches
- Introduction of a Two-Gun Match (rifle & pistol) – we held 2 such events
- 120 participants took advantage of this exciting season

The 2019 season will attempt to match or exceed what occurred in 2018. ***If you own an AR style rifle and are bored with just shooting from a bench, then take a hard look at ARC.*** Information is located on the website under the Program section and more detailed information can be found from the flyers contained in past 2018 issues of the Newsletter also located on the website.
